## 200-225 YOUTH

200-225 youth served annually by our Foster Care and Adoption Program



Little City newest locations in **Matteson** and **Joliet** started accepting intakes in 2022.

In FY24, we met DCFS targets (**25% exit rate**) for adoption and guardianship permanencies for our specialized youth.



The foster care program as reunified **20 youths** who have remained home with their birth families.

# 100%

**100%** of youth served remain free from abuse and neglect while in our care, and upon six months after leaving our care.

We were awarded a **\$650,000 grant** to expand our community-based clinical services to Medicaid clients in under-resourced areas throughout Chicago.

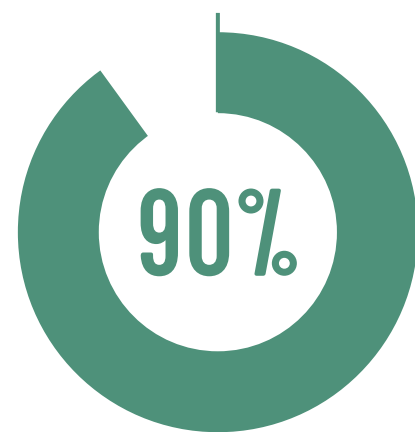

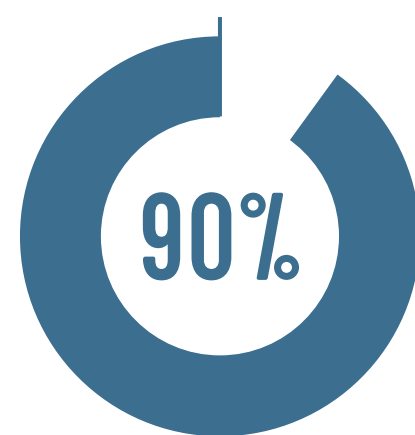

Fifteen families became licensed homes and **71% of relatives** were licensed in 2024, exceeding the statewide benchmark
